FIELD AVAILABILITY AND CONDITION

WARREN FARM

There has been no further sign of activity at Warren Farm.

The situation was discussed at the Norwood Green ward Forum on 28th October, and the following is an extract from the minutes of that meeting :-

Warren Farm: Queens Park Rangers – further update

Councillor Mann asked DF to update residents. DF reported that he had asked Jonathan Kirby – the council's Assistant Director, Major Projects and Development, and who has been leading the negotiations with Queens Park Rangers – to provide a review of the present situation, as follows:

The club are looking at reducing the overall cost of the scheme and are currently working through this with their professional design teams. The owner of the club, following his meeting with the Leader of the Council, has re-confirmed the club's commitment to the project and their desire to build facilities at Warren Farm. Senior officials from the club will be meeting with the council's lead officers in the coming weeks to review the scheme and revised costings.

Bob Howard from Warren Farm Radio Flyers reported on difficulties at their relocated venue, Rectory Park, Northolt. DF noted that the Club had been provided with contact telephone numbers for the local park rangers should any problems re-occur."

We shall continue to monitor the situation at future Ward Forum meetings.
