FIELD CONDITION & AVAILABILITY

Bad News , Good News and More Good News!

The bad news is that the runway area which the LBE contractors have endeavoured to prepare for us is virtually useless. It is far too small, badly rutted and full of holes dug by foxes. As fast as the contractors fill in the holes, the fox digs them up again!

The first piece of good news is that the cricket outfield is in very good condition, so we are able to use this area.
