FLYING - AT LAST!

We are delighted to report that the return to Warren Farm has been an outstanding success.

Scarcely a day has gone by without somebody flying, often in groups far larger than we ever saw at Rectory Park. Two of our "Lapsed Members" have already rejoined, and others that we have not seen in ages have been flying with us again.

We should stress that this is only a temporary respite, as we will need to leave again when QPR begin their redevelopment work, however it is hoped that we will be able to have a full season of flying until at least late September. Whether LBE will be able to make more permanent facilities available to us in due course remains to be seen.

FIELD CONDITION & AVAILABILITY

The mown runway is in excellent condition, suitable for all sizes of model (within our club rules, of course). There is no football or cricket to interfere with our activities, although we have encountered a few people walking their dogs on the runway. Fortunately, we have not encountered any dog mess – they seem to be better behaved than the Rectory Park dog owners.

No doubt they will soon realise that the mown area has been prepared as our runway, however please keep an eye open and call landing very loudly. It is a good idea to carry out a low (40ft) circuit to give you a chance to scan the runway for obstructions before committing to a final approach.

GATE

Paul and Bob still have a few keys. Please give one of us a call if you need to collect a key, and we will also demonstrate how to lock the gate (it is a bit tricky). It is important to keep the gate locked at all times to discourage another incursion by travellers.
