BIG NEWS UPDATE

The big news is that the proposal to build a sports centre on our flying site has been abandoned by Ealing Council. Instead, it will be designated as a "Nature Reserve", in effect leaving the site much as it is now.

Both the Nature Reserve group and Ealing Council have issued assurances that our club will be able to continue to fly at the site, although it is not yet clear whether our runway will remain in it's current location. Initial plans suggest that we will need to move the runway 50 - 100 metres to the right. This will bring us back to the location where we always flew before our enforced migration to Rectory Park. Any relocation will have to take into account restrictions arising from the latest CAA regulations, which prohibit flying too close to buildings, roads and railway lines etc.

All of this is probably some years away, so for the time being it remains business as usual.
