There is also information on Remote ID requirements, but these will not come into effect until 2028.

As the end of year approaches, I suggest that members pay BMFA fees directly to the BMFA, leaving only the club subscription to be paid to WFRF. Let me or Richard know if this will be a problem for anybody.
